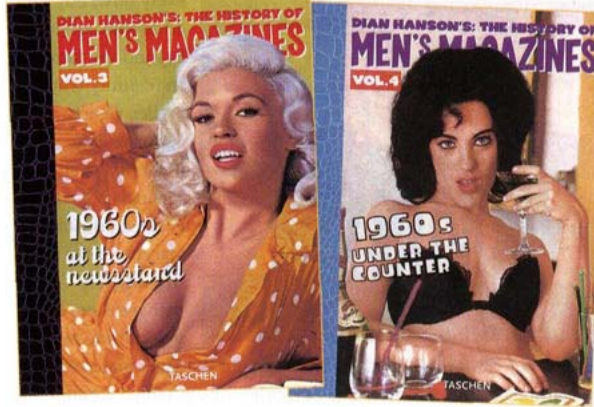

Ever since we got our paws on the first two books in Dian Hanson's landmark series, we've been chomping at the bit for the next instalments to come out. Now they're here, and as impressive as the previous two. In these stunningly bound volumes, Hanson



chronicles the global rise of the top shelf mag and its under-the-counter counterparts in the '60s, through a stunning array of hundreds of magazine images and a smattering of entertaining essays on the industry's development. Dian covers pinup fashions (big breasts and beehives), post-war humour and adventure mags, the origins of foot fetishism, changing attitudes to censorship and provides succinct and fascinating biographies of the major movers and shakers in men's 'art' mags. It's the pictures that really tell the story though – a decade of magazine covers show us the political and social environment of the times as much as they show us tits. A painstaking and essential historical tribute to a long neglected industry. **AL**
