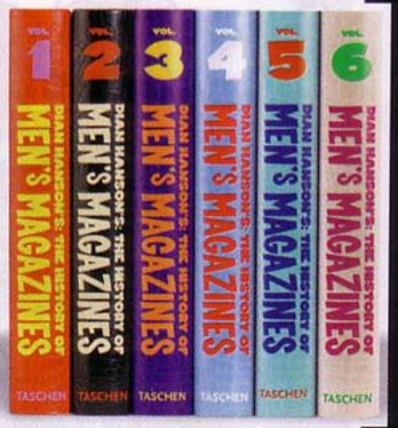


**DIAN HANSON**—the longtime editor of *Leg Show* and *Juggs*, among others—has compiled *The History of Men's Magazines*, a series of hardcover books that every red-blooded American male should own.

Each handsome edition is packed with the best smut ever printed. Eye-catching covers, sexy photo-sets, cartoons and even ads have been painstakingly catalogued for your pleasure. Hanson draws material from popular nudie mags, lesser-known XXX periodicals and obscure European publications.

Latest in the ever-growing series are two recently released tomes that take an in-depth look at an era near and dear to our heart—the swingin' '70s!

*Volume 5: 1970s at the Newsstand* documents the true golden age of adult magazines, when the once-taboo art of porn became a mainstream hit. Entire chapters are devoted to the major publications like *Cheri*, *Screw* and, of course, the greatest men's magazine ever—*HUSTLER*. One of our most infamous covers of all time is featured in Volume 5—the ultrarare meat grinder image that graced the June 1978 edition and literally had
