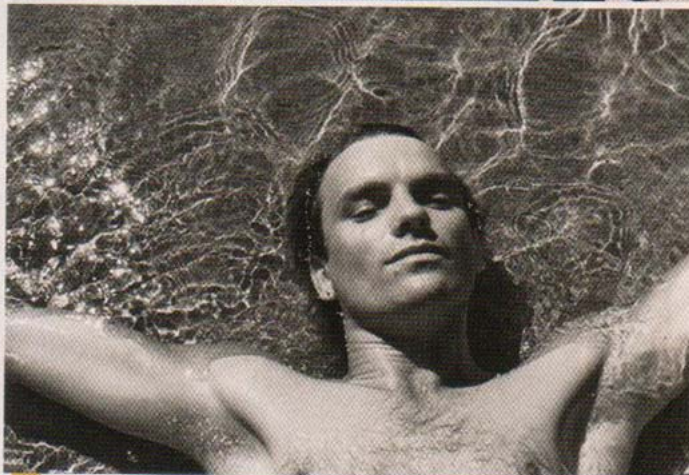
Famous friends came out to toast Andy Summers at an exhibit of his photos from the '80s heyday of his band, the recently reunited the Police.

With the Police reuniting for a smash worldwide tour some 20-plus years in the making, Andy Summers, the band's guitarist, celebrated the release of his forthcoming book *I'll Be Watching You: Inside The Police 1980-83* (Taschen) at Frank Pictures Gallery in Bergamot Station, the funky arts complex in Santa Monica. The mood was euphoric as Police tunes played in the background and friends, family and fans overflowed from the gallery, which was exhibiting a selection of the photos. Jeremy Piven, Harvey Keitel, Gina Gershon and of course bandmates Sting (with wife Trudie Styler) and Stewart Copeland supported Summers' big night. *Hollywood Life* co-sponsored the event along with Frank Pictures Gallery, HP, Taschen, Vicious Vodka, POM Tea and Bon Vivant catering. The collection of photos Summers took during the band's ascent to global fame in the early '80s is a visual lexicon of everything Police, from the tour bus to the recording studio to even private time in the hotel suite—an intimate look at the daily lives of one of the world's biggest musical acts at the height of their success.—Alexis Johnson
