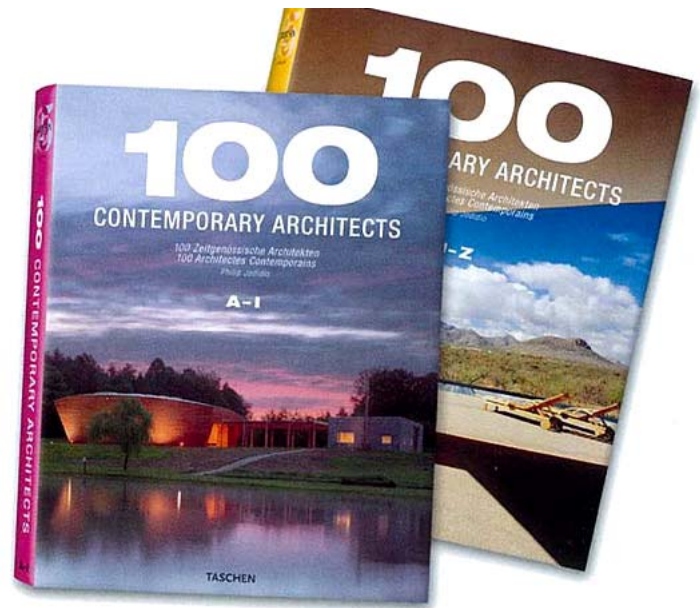


## 100 Contemporary Architects

If the *Phaidon Atlas* is the definitive map of the architecture world, then this is the quintessential Yellow Pages – and not just because it comes in two massive volumes, labelled A-I and J-Z. Although unlike the Yellow Pages, you will actually use these books, and for much more than a monitor stand. Authored by Phillip Jodido, one of the world's most renowned architecture writers, this special edition celebrates the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Taschen publishing, and features up-and-coming architects alongside industry maestros. It has all the big names in international architecture, not to mention their phone and fax numbers, street and email addresses, and websites. Add to this a short biography for each architect, multi-page illustrated features on their notable projects, and more photographs, plans, sketches and renderings than you can poke a stick at, and *100 Contemporary Architects* is more than a public directory. It's more like an insider's address book, though packed with more dossiers than one person could accrue over an entire lifetime in the industry. It is like a large-scale rolodex worth its (hefty) weight in gold, perfect for those who haven't found time to schmooze their way through the industry.
