



## COMPLETE WORKS, 1979-2009: ZAHA HADID

The controversial British-Iraqi architect who claimed "I don't design nice buildings" once studied under Rem Koolhaas and started her London practice in the 80s, although she only built her first UK construction in 2006. With her trademark fluid shapes, some of the most recognised of her completed structures are the Rosenthal Center for Contemporary Art in Cincinnati and the Central Building of the new BMW Assembly Plant in Leipzig, but many of her award-winning designs have never been actualised, some saying the works are unbuildable. Here, the plans that exist within the realm of the (im)possible sit alongside images of finished buildings in a tome that spans her entire career, supplemented by text and many of Hadid's own drawings.
