



4. Life & Times. In one of the most comprehensive collections of his work, **The Complete Frank Lloyd Wright** (Taschen, \$200) covers the architecture genius from A to Z. The three-volume monograph includes the renowned designer's entire works, both realized and unrealized, from 1943 to 1959. Also detailed are Wright's postwar years, considered his "living architecture" period, which defined a modern era of the home. From his Prairie Houses to his fantastical vision of a "living city," Wright's oeuvre informed a generation of designers with the wealth of possibilities that he drew from. Including drawings and sketches made of structures intended for Marilyn Monroe and Arthur Miller as well as breathtaking photography of his tangible art, this volume tells the story of both a life and a genre of expression.
