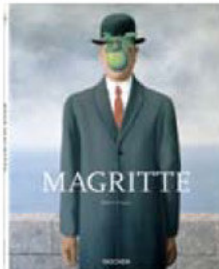


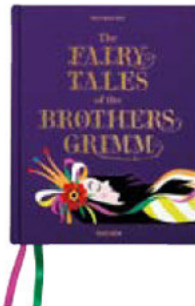
PAGE TURNERS

You are what you read, according to Leah Price, a book history scholar and author of *Unpacking My Library*: "To expose a bookshelf is to compose a self." Here, a trio of tomes to impress the guests:



Magritte by Marcel Paquet, US\$14.99 (\$18.90). Known for his surrealist paintings, René Magritte (1898–1967) was revered for his imaginative and sometimes ridiculous renditions.

The Fairy Tales of the Brothers Grimm by Noel David, US\$39.99 (\$50.40). This new translation of the German siblings' best-loved stories includes *Cinderella*, *Sleeping Beauty* and *Hansel and Gretel*. Each tale is also accompanied by lovely vintage illustrations by Viktor Paul Mohn and Walter Crane, among others.



Pinxit by Mark Ryden, US\$1,000 (\$1,260). Often considered the godfather of Pop Surrealism, Ryden's aesthetic fuses kitschy and psychic



for a poignant beauty. This limited-edition retrospective – each of the 1,000 copies is signed by the artist – features works from his 20-year career and a dozen of them actually fold out to 150cm across.
