Photographer shares unpublished shots of Monroe

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Before their famous photo shoot for Paris Match in 1962, photographer **Lawrence Schiller**, all of 25 years old, told Marilyn Monroe: "You're already famous; now you're going to make me famous."

And she did. You can see for yourself and meet Schiller at Taschen's launch for an exhibition of photos from *Marilyn & Me* at 6 p.m. Tuesday at the publisher's bookstore at 1111 Lincoln Rd., Miami Beach.

Two-thirds of the book, which features four foldouts and a cover of a custom woven silk, is made up of unpublished photos of the star; the ultra lavish limited edition version, printed on archival paper, goes for \$1,000. If your budget isn't quite that expansive, you can get a text-only version of Schiller's memoir published by Nan A. Talese/Doubleday that sells for \$20.
