

Monroe pics shared on Beach

Before their famous photo shoot for Paris Match in 1962, photographer **Lawrence Schiller**, all of 25 years old, told Marilyn Monroe: "You're already famous; now you're going to make me famous."

And she did. You can see for yourself and meet Schiller at **Taschen's** launch for an exhibition of photos from *Marilyn & Me* at 6 p.m. Tuesday at the publisher's bookstore at 1111 Lincoln Rd., Miami Beach.

Two-thirds of the book, which features four foldouts and a cover of a custom woven silk, is made up of unpublished photos of the star; the ultra lavish limited edition version, printed on archival paper, goes for \$1,000. If your budget isn't quite that expansive, you can get a text-only version of Schiller's memoir published by Nan A. Talese/Doubleday that sells for \$20.

BACK ON BROADWAY

Katie Finneran, the former Miamian and two-time Tony Award winner seen most recently on the Fox TV series *I Hate My Teenage Daughter*, is headed back to Broadway. A **New World School of the Arts** alumna, Finneran will play the orphan-hating Miss Hannigan in the revival of the Tony-winning musical *Annie*.

The much-loved show begins previews Oct. 3 and opens Nov. 8 at the Palace Theatre. The creative team includes Tony winners James Lapine as director and Andy Blankenbuehler as choreographer, with the title character played by

11-year-old Lilla Crawford. Finneran won her Tonys for work in two revivals, *Promises, Promises* and *Noises Off*, so maybe there's a threepeat in her future.
