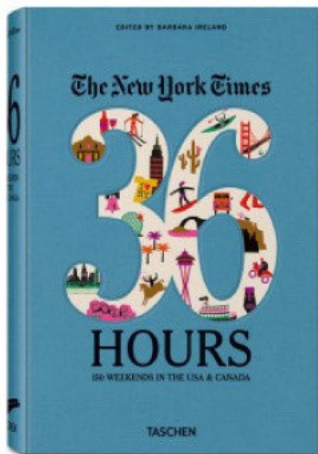


A Must Have NY Times Travel Book
